The Hospice Medicare Benefit

Who is eligible for hospice?

Anyone who has been certified by both their physician and a hospice physician as having a life expectancy of six months or less if their illness runs its normal course, who has a desire to pursue comfort care instead of curative treatment, and who elects to enroll in a Medicare-approved hospice program such as ours.

How long is coverage provided?

For as long as the patient's doctor and hospice physician certify that he or she is terminally ill and has a life expectancy of six months or less. Certification is given for two 90-day periods followed by an unlimited number of 60-day periods.

Who pays for hospice care?

Facing a terminal illness brings with it many challenges. Paying for end-of-life care shouldn't be one of them. Medicare, Medi-Cal, and Tri-Care fully cover hospice services. Many private insurance plans offer a hospice benefit, but the extent of their coverage may differ from Medicare. No patient will ever be turned away from Hospice of Santa Cruz County for financial reasons.

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The Hospice Medicare Benefit

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What services are covered?

Our team works closely with each patient, along with his or her doctor and loved ones to create a custom care plan to meet specific patient needs and honor cultural, spiritual, religious, and/or other preferences. Our goal is to manage the symptoms of the illness to relieve suffering and allow for comfort and dignity.

Care includes oversight from a hospice physician/medical director; regular visits from a hospice nurse; medications for symptom control and pain relief; medical equipment and supplies, such as a wheelchair, hospital bed, or oxygen; personal care support from a hospice aide; help with planning and caregiving from a social worker; volunteer support to run errands and meet practical needs; support from a spiritual counselor as well as music therapy if desired.
